Applicants for renewal of 1960 licenses must present:

1. 1961 motor vehicle tax statement
2. 1960 registration certificate

(Please add your street address, Post Office Box number, or route number if it is not shown on the certificate.)

Applicants for new licenses must present:

1. Fourth copy of title issued in CASS County
2. 1961 tax statement

Empty weight certificates are required on trucks licensed with commercial plates - this is not necessary on renewals.

Non-Resident military license renewals require:

1. 1961 certificate of non-resident status
2. 1960 registration certificate

New plates will be issued on X-trailers and motorcycles. On passenger car and trucks, small adhesive decals will be issued instead of new plates. Decals must be attached to the lower right-hand corner of the 1960 plate.

If new plates are to be mailed, please include 25c postage
