McMillan Attends Insurance Meeting

Jim McMillan, State Farm local agent in Plattsmouth, attended a meeting at Town House in Omaha, Wednesday, one of 106 such gatherings held simultaneously throughout the U.S. and in Canada by his company.

Featured at the meeting was a closed-circuit broadcast of a speech by Adlai H. Rust, chairman of the board of directors of the State Farm Insurance Companies. Rust predicted a growing economy for the decade and forecast continued growth in both human and automobile populations — and a resulting increase in need for insurance coverages.

Included in the audience, estimated at over 20,000, were agents, managers and other personnel of the State Farm Companies. Production goals for 1961 and the remainder of the 60's were outlined and a special contest for agents was announced.

Central Sells S.D. Electric Property

Central Electric & Gas Company of Lincoln, Nebraska; Northern States Power Company of Minneapolis, Minnesota; and Northwestern Public Service Company of Huron, South Dakota, have entered into an agreement for the sale, to Northwestern and Northern States, all of Central's electrical properties in South Dakota east of the Missouri River at an undisclosed price. Central will retain its natural gas properties in this area.

This sale will include all distribution systems, transmission lines, and the generating plants at Chamberlain, Woonsocket, and Salem, South Dakota.

Northwestern Public Service will purchase all Central electrical property west of a line south of Woonsocket, and Northern States will purchase all Central's electrical properties east of the line.

The sale of these properties in South Dakota is in line with Central's policy of consolidating its holdings into efficient and economically feasible operational units.
