# 'Lost World' Is Trip To Pre-History

"The Lost World," Irwin Allen's production of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's gripping story of a trip to prehistoric land, filmed in CinemaScope and De Luxe Color, starring Michael Rennie, Jill St. John, David Hedison, Claude Rains and Fernando Lamas plays Sunday, Monday and Tuesday, January 8-9-10 at the Cass Theatre.

Stranger than the wildest science fiction dreams is the land of the "lost world" where Jurassic monsters from 150,000,000 B.C. roam at will, where dinosaurs rule the land and man-eating plants reach out at every bend in the trail.

This is the untamed and untouched place that zoology professor Challenger (Claude Rains) takes his unforgettable expedition to. Accompanying him on this journey into the past are Lord Roxton (Michael Rennie), a playboy and big game hunter, Jennifer Holmes (Jill St. John), daughter of an executive who finances the venture; David Holmes (Ray Strickland), Jennifer's brother; Ed Malone (David Hedison), American newsman and professor Summerlee (Richard Haydn), a scientist.

Joining the expedition at a remote trading post on the Amazon are Gomez (Fernando Lamas), who pilots the helicopter to the plateau of "The Lost World," and Costa (Jay Novella) a jungle agent and guide.

Unknown animals menace the party at every turn. A large animal blocks their path upon arrival and knocks the helicopter over a cliff. It is identified by Prof. Challenger as a brontosaurus, but still the party plunges deeper into the unknown.

The age-old adage that "truth is stranger than fiction" certainly does not hold true in this case. Produced and directed by Irwin Allen, the CinemaScope De Luxe Color presentation of the Doyle classic would tend to make a fallacy of these words.

**NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS**

January 1 is the assessment date for the State of Nebraska.

Assessment schedules must be in the County Assessor's office by March 1, 1961 in order to avoid the penalty.

All persons between the ages of 21 and 60 must pay the Head Tax of \$3.50 unless specifically exempt by law.

In regard to the grain tax, the tenant is required to report the landlord's share of the grain, unless the landlord is active in production of the grain. The landlord to pay the tax for his share. Tenants please have the number of bushels of grain for each landlord divided from the amount to be assessed to you, and the school district in which the grain was produced before you go to file your assessment.

Truck owners not receiving a motor vehicle statement, should contact this office, as more information is needed for the 1961 valuation, than shown on the 1960 registration.
