Family Reunion at Mrs. Behrns Home

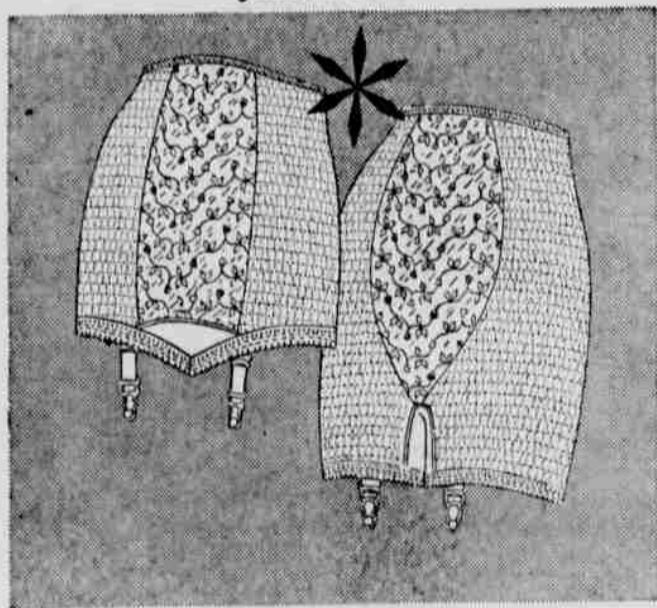
AVOCA (Special) — A family reunion was held at the Mrs. Joe Behrns home Memorial Day.
