

Young Men: Your Draft Board Would Like Some Information

A message for youths nearing their 18th birthday: Your Selective Service Board wants you to get in touch soon—and keep in touch.

In Plattsmouth, the Board's office is on the third floor of the County Courthouse.

Young men must register on their 18th birthday or within five days after that date.

This is a "must" even though a youth is enlisted in a Reserve or National Guard unit.

All males born after Aug. 30, 1922, are required to comply. Soon after your 20th birthday, a questionnaire will be mailed to you.

Confidential information you supply will be used by the Local Selective Service Board to determine your classification.

When you receive notice of classification, you have 10 days to ask for a personal appearance before your local board; or you can file an appeal for further review by a Board of Appeal.

In addition to any change of address, you must advise the Board of changes in physical condition and occupational, marital, family, dependency and military status.

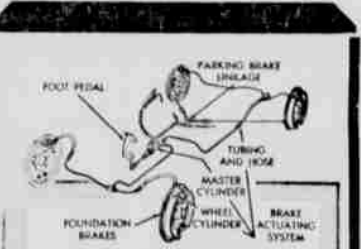
