## Fertilized Corn Needs One-Fourth As Much Water

CHICAGO — Only one-fourth as much water is needed to produce a bushel of fertilized corn as unfertilized corn, reports Dr. B. N. Driskell, University of Kentucky soils specialist, in a statement cited here by the Midwest Regional office of the National Plant Food Institute.

"Properly fertilized corn yielded 79 bushels per acre in a test," says Dr. Driskell, "compared with only 18 bushels for the unfertilized corn."

"But the fertilized corn used only 16 inches of water a season and the unfertilized 14 inches. This figures out to 5,000 gallons of water per bushel for the 79-bushel crop and 21,000 gallons per bushel for the unfertilized crop.

"The roots of fertilized corn go deeper and use more subsoil. A higher stalk population in the fertilized field slows down air speed and reduces evaporation per stalk.

"Moreover, fertilized corn's rapid growth increases shade and lowers the temperature of the soil and of the leaves. This reduces evaporation. In addition, proper fertilization hastens maturity of the corn plants, so there is less competition from weeds for available water supplies."
