

months. By law the department head, called the purchasing agent, has authority to buy all articles used Monday. by state agencies, except the University of Nebraska, the teachers colleges at Wayne, Chadron, Peru and Kearney and the Board of Control.

The purchasing agent also sells surplus state property. In 1943 the Legislature directed that the purchasing agent be named by the governor, with approval of the Legislature. Pay was set at \$3,000
