In 1935 the church was sold and so down came the last vestige of life at Eight Mile Grove.

Its people have moved away. Its families are spread all over this county and many others besides but deep in their hearts many of them, like Mrs. Spangler, look lovingly back on memories of a home in Eight Mile Grove, a thriving town tied by a busy stage route to Plattsmouth.
