### SHELTERS FOR NEWLYWEDS

Denver — Anthropologist Margaret Mead urges bombproof shelters for the world's newlyweds—to assure continuance of the human race in the event of nuclear war.

Dr. Mead, of the American Museum of Natural History, offered this suggestion to the one hundred and twenty-eighth meeting of the American Association of the Advancement of Science recently.

Derrick Dunlop, professor of Edinburgh University, said: "It takes a very civilized man to be able to idle gracefully."
