## The British Try To Fly

In Great Britain, where sport is given great emphasis, a number of daring-do individuals are trying to learn to fly without the aid of motors and engines. They are trying to learn to fly by their own strength.

This has, of course, been the dream of mankind since the dawn of civilization. For centuries men tried to fashion wings worked like those of the birds.

But now, half a century after man conquered the air with an engine, the sporting instinct of the British may have brought them to the verge of success. From reports leaking out of England, where each success is a guarded secret, it seems that at least two men have flown under their own power.

And if, through some marvelous gear system, or wing system, we could learn to fly, if but briefly, it would add a new dimension to our lives. It would allow us to hop up over traffic jams, or small barriers or streams, and have fun in the process. The British may find the answer, if science does not have it first, in the way of a one-man flying belt, which might discourage the age-old search for human flight.

Someday, however, man — individual man — will fly. It will end a search which has lasted thousands of years. And it seems likely that the goal will be realized in this century — maybe by the sporting types in England.

## Down Memory Lane

### 40 YEARS AGO

The County Commissioners at their session today took up a number of matters in line of retrenchment of the expenses of the county and one of the first steps taken was that of doing away with the office of

county highway commissioner and in which the county board expects to make a saving of some \$2,000 for the county taxpayers during the year. While this office has made a good showing and been valuable in the work of construction of the different road projects carried on during the past year, it is figured that there is now very little new construction ahead and the main task in the future will be looking after the upkeep of the network of federal aid roads that have already been constructed, which the commissioners believe they can handle by themselves. It was decided to divide the road work among the members of the board so that they can render efficient service in the way of handling the maintenance work. Mr. Farley will have charge of patrol No. 1 and the keeping of the records of the road work of the county; Mr. Harris will have the supervision of patrols Nos. 2 and 3 and Mr. Gorder of 4 and 5, and this will cover the entire county in this manner so that the work that the highway commissioner has been doing may still be kept up at less expense to the county.
