Some of the provisions of Or-dinance No. 1025:

-The provisions of the National Electric Code for the year 1959 are adopted as part of the ordi-

-The office of Electrical Inspector is created to enforce provisions of the ordinance. The Inspector will be appointed by the mayor. He may be an electrician engaged in installing electrical apparatus in Plattsmouth but he will not inspect his own work; there may be alternate inspec-

-An Installation Permit shall be obtained by licensed electricians-\$7.50 for wiring any new single family residence or addition to an existing residence; \$15
