Lincoln — Cooking utensils have various uses and limitations. A glass pie plate browns the bottom crust better than aluminum. An aluminum pan allows a cake to bake without excessive browning of the crust. Boiling hard water will not discolor stainless steel. 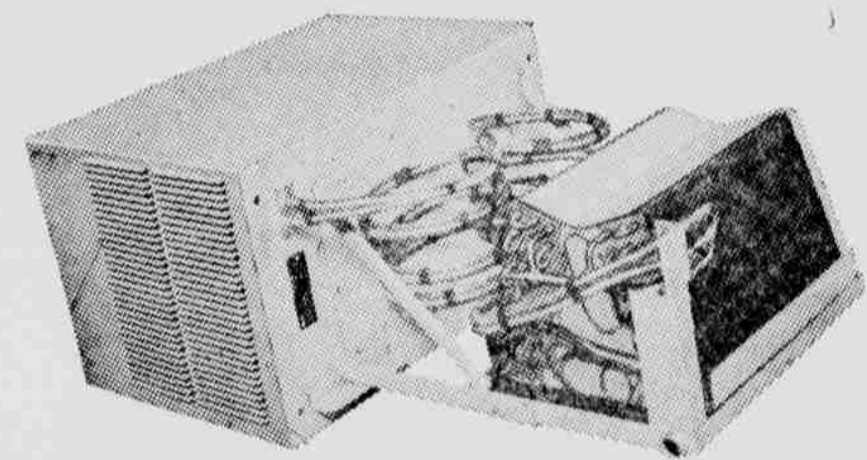
