## Pheasant Population Near Last Year's

LINCOLN — Nebraska's spring pheasant population is about the same as that of 1961, a good year, based on a statewide count made in late April by rural mail carriers in co-operation with the Game Commission.

While the statewide count indicated about as many birds as last spring, it was down 7 per cent from the 1955-62 average of approximately 11 birds per 100 miles. The number of hens observed was the same as that reported last year.
