ORDINANCE NO. 1030
AN ORDINANCE CREATING STREET IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 167 IN THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, CASS COUNTY, NEBRASKA, PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF STREET IMPROVEMENTS THEREIN.
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF PLATTSMOUTH, NEBRASKA:
SECTION 1. Street Improvement District No. 167 is hereby created and shall include all of the area within the following outer boundaries:
Commencing at the Northwest Corner of Lot 2 in Block 37 in Young and Hays Addition to the City of Plattsmouth, running thence east along the north line of said Lot 2 extended to the east line of Lot 3 in said Block 38 in Young and Hays Addition to the City of Plattsmouth; thence south on the east line of Lot 3, Block 38 in Young and Hays Addition extended to the southeast corner of Lot 6 in Block 38 in Young and Hays Addition to the City of Plattsmouth;
Thence west on the south line of Lot 6 in Block 38 in Young and Hays Addition to the City of Plattsmouth extended to the southwest corner of Lot 7 in Block 37 in Young and Hays Addition to the City of Plattsmouth;
Thence north on the west line of Lot 7 in Block 37 in Young and Hays Addition extended to the north line of Lot 3 in Block 37 in Young and Hays Addition to the City of Plattsmouth, which is the point of beginning.

SECTION 2. The following street in said District shall be improved by paving, grading, curbing, guttering and such other work as may be incidental thereto:
THIRTEENTH STREET, from the south line of First Avenue, also known as Pearl Street, to the north line of Third Avenue, also known as Granite Street.
SECTION 3. Said improvements shall be made at public cost but the City will levy special assessments on the property especially benefited thereby, proportionate to the benefits as provided by law.
SECTION 4. All work essential for or necessarily incidental to the construction of said improvements shall be done in connection therewith as a part thereof and all said improvements shall be constructed in accordance with the plans and specifications to be prepared by Henningson, Durham & Richardson, Inc., special engineer employed by the City, and to be approved by the City Council.
