**Notice To Taxpayers**

January 1 is the assessment date for the State of Nebraska.

Assessment schedules must be in the County Assessor's office by March 1, 1963 in order to avoid the penalty.

All persons between the ages of 21 and 60 must pay the Head Tax of \$3.50, unless specifically exempt by law.

In regard to the grain tax, the tenant is required to report the landlord's share of the grain, unless the landlord is active in production of the grain. The landlord to pay the tax for his share. Tenants please have the number of bushels of grain for each landlord divided from the amount to be assessed to you, and the school district in which the grain was produced before you go to file your assessment.
