

Big, Tough Blair Here Friday

Blair High School, tall and big and tough and 3-0 for the season, gives Plattsmouth High a stern return to cage action here Friday night.

Game time is 8 o'clock after the Reserves of the schools have played at 6:30.

Like the Devils, Blair has been on vacation since before Christmas.

For both, the game will be the second of the season in the Ak-Sar-Ben Conference where Blair is defending champion. Plattsmouth holds a win over Papillion, Blair defeated Ashland.

Coach Jerry Rainforth will bring in a team which is mostly

new since graduation claimed most of last year's first-liners.

But, he has 6-5, 235-pound Larry Hansen who was a regular last season when his team went to the finals of the Class B State Meet and 6-4 Steve Refsell, brother of Paul Refsell the All-Stater, who made the grade as a regular toward the last of the season. Hansen was an All-State tackle the past football season.

Blair has other height, too, and has shown enough in wins over Columbus St. Bonaventure, Ashland, and South Sioux City to instill itself as the team-to-beat in the Ak-Sar-Ben.

Coach Lowell Johnson of Plattsmouth expects his squad to be at full strength, despite ankle injuries which have had two regulars hobbling.
