

Blue Devils Defeat Tekamah, Ashland; Reach .500 Rating

Plattsmouth Draws Papillion In 1st Round of 'B' District

Plattsmouth won two games, one with difficulty and one easily, last weekend to pull up to an even .500 won-lost mark for the season.

The Blue Devils made their record 7-8 at Tekamah Friday night with a 46-42 win in a four-quarter contest they won with a fourth-quarter rally.

They became 8-8 here Saturday night with a coasting 67-44 win over Ashland.

Dan Schultz was high scorer in both games, getting 14 at Tekamah, 17 here against Ashland.

The Friday night game was whittled to a halt 52 times for personal fouls. The teams combined for 88 points, although they scored only 27 field goals.

Plattsmouth was outgunned from the field, 14-13, but was better at the gift line, 20-14. Neither team was too efficient free throw shooting, Plattsmouth missing 18 and Tekamah, 17.

The last quarter when Plattsmouth came from a 29-38 deficit to win. Roger Laum and Roger Beverage contributed two baskets each and Schultz three points.

Saturday night, Plattsmouth got off to a 17-8 first-quarter lead and was ahead 34-19 and 46-26 at the other stops.

Ashland was never in the game. Bruce Hosc scored 17 to keep his team from complete oblivion.

Nine Plattsmouth players got in on the scoring.

Next for the Blue Devils is the regular season finale, Friday night at Bellevue.

Nebraskans Need Boating Safety Course

LINCOLN — If the number of boating accidents is any indication, Nebraskans need further instruction in boating and water safety.

Last year in the state 27 boating accidents resulted in 6 deaths and 12 injuries compared to 17 accidents, 6 deaths, and 9 injuries the year before.

The increase came in spite of the fact that the Game Commission has given boating safety instruction to more than 1,000 Nebraska youngsters in high schools, 4-H groups, and scout troops over the state.

Dudley Osborn, Game Commission boating supervisor, noted that it is the adults, however, who own the boats and do most of the operating.

Each year the number of boats on Nebraska waters increases. In 1962 the Commission registered 17,416 boats — over a thousand more than the 16,153 registered during 1961.

The most frequent boating violation last year was operating a boat not adequately equipped with approved life jackets.

Law enforcement officers and the Information and Tourism Division of the Commission are helping to promote boating and safety in the field and through the mass media.

These efforts, however, cannot ensure the safety of those afloat. Individuals in a boat determine their own safety, the Game Commission warned.
