Camp Fire Council Hears Talk on Emergency 'Aid'

Wayne Schneider, as a representative of the Red Cross, appeared before the Camp Fire Leaders' Association Feb. 26 at a special meeting. He gave a lesson on first aid.

This was not a regular Red Cross First Aid course, but touched on emergencies that might arise with a group of girls. He talked about cleaning and bandaging of wounds, stopping bleeding by applying pressure, treatment of shock and artificial respiration. He briefly mentioned burns: "don't do anything but wrap loosely."

Schneider stressed the fact that this is first aid only, and when an accident occurs that seems serious someone else should be getting a doctor or an ambulance so the patient can have professional care.

He concluded by hoping that the ladies "would never have to use the information he had given, but it is useful to know."
