AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING HILL CITY ADDITION TO THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, NEBRASKA, AND ACCEPTING THE DEDICATION OF THE STREET THEREIN AND APPROVING THE PLAT THEREOF FOR PUBLIC USE.  
WHEREAS Ray E. Story and Adella Story, being the sole owners of the land described and embraced within Hill City Addition as hereinafter more specifically described, have filed their written consent to the annexation thereof to the City of Plattsmouth and the passage of an ordinance extending the

corporate limits of said City to include said addition and WHEREAS the West half of vacated Waugh Street, also known as 22nd Street, has been dedicated to public use in said addition.  
NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, NEBRASKA:

**Steady to Higher Start on Stock At Omaha Market**  
Fat cattle and fat lambs sold higher, and butcher hogs and sows steady to a bit better, in opening trade this week at Omaha.

Light supply for a Monday got credit for the upturn of fat cattle, an advance that measured 25-50c. High-choice to prime 1150-pound steers topped at \$23.50; comparable 935-pound heifers at \$23.25. Other steers and yearlings ranged from \$21.50 to \$23.25, with weights to 1322 included, at \$23; other heifers \$21.50-\$23, plainer cattle \$21 down.

Cows sold fully steady with recent upturns, bulk \$13-\$16.50, a few as high as \$17. Bologna bulls sold to \$19, veal calves to \$27, those tops sparingly paid. Replacement cattle sold steady. Good to choice 607-pound Oklahoma stock steers sold at \$25.50; 519-pound stock heifers at \$24.50. Medium to good feeder steers weighing 750-910 went at \$21-\$22, and 950-pound Holstein-feeder steers at \$18.25. The latter showed some grain.

Butcher hogs and sows were steady to a quarter up, butchers weighing 190-330 from \$13 to \$14.50, top figure equalling the 37-month low set the previous Friday; sows from 270-600, \$12-\$13.25.

Fat lambs started the week mostly a quarter higher, instantly 50c up, woolled \$18.25-\$19.50, one load \$19.75; shorn \$18-\$18.75. Slaughter ewes at \$5.50-\$7, and 78-pound shorn feeder lambs at \$17.50, were rated steady.
