

Mental Health is —DAR
Program at Club Meeting

Why Nebraska is now the nation's second most advanced state in the promotion of mental health, after neighboring Kansas was explained at the April 11 meeting of the Goldenrod Study Club.

Colored slides were shown when the program was presented by Nebraska Psychiatric Institute Coordinator Joanna Nelle.

"The purpose of the Nebraska Psychiatric program of treatment, training and research now gives help sooner and provides closer care to mental health patients," she said.

Nebraska's program has reversed the prediction of 5,000 patients to 3,000 patients by the 1960's.

Vitamin boosters, tranquilizers, increased awareness of physical cultural and mental needs replace outmoded shock-treatment and confinement at the Institute.

Appraisal is shared with a team of psychiatrists, educational therapists, trained technicians and mental health educators. From a background of major research the staff through study and discussion of a patient gain insight for diagnosis and treatment.

Miss Nelle said valuable aids for patients at the Nebraska Psychiatric Institute are the use of the library, television and sound communications with other clinical centers.

"The trend in Nebraska is to provide care within one hour's driving distance for patients. Clinics serve 25 counties in Nebraska today and 70% of the mental health patients can be cured she stated.
