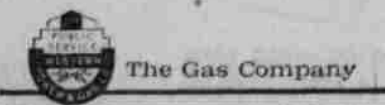

County Extension Offices Have '63 Weed Control Guides

LINCOLN—A guide to "Chemicals That Control Weeds" in the field as well as in lawns and gardens is available at County Extension Offices throughout Nebraska.
 The circular, EC 63-130 contains latest information on the effective ways to control various weeds based on University of Nebraska Agricultural Experiment Station tests.
 Sections in the circular include recommendations for pre-plant preemergence and post-emergence weed control in field crops. Other sections include recommendations for controlling weeds in pastures, non-crop areas, lawns and other areas. In addition, there is a special section on controlling troublesome weeds and woody plants.
