She came to Plattsmouth as a young woman in her early 20s when her father started a drug store. June 1, 1892, she was married to John Henry Herold at the family home at 4th Street and Avenue B. They lived for awhile above Herold's Store, and later in a home at 8th and Main Streets. She moved into the home she now occupies about 1903. The Herolds had five children.
