

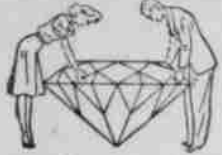
### Navy Mothers Meet

It was announced that some of the members exhibited at the Cass County Fair in order to meet one of the club's goals.

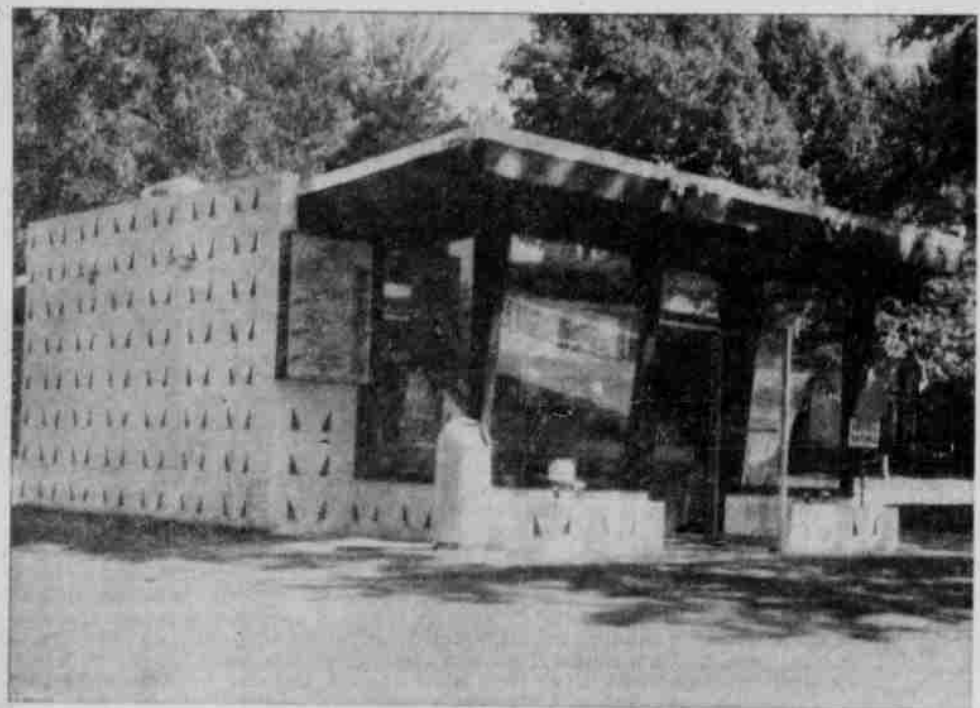
