\$3 Million for GI Home Loans in Nebraska

An additional \$3,000,000 has been made available for direct home loans to Nebraska war veterans during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1963. A. H. Duxbury, VA Regional Office Manager in Lincoln, announced today that more than \$3,600,000 direct home loans have been made to Nebraska veterans in the first 6 months of 1963. Direct loans to eligible war veterans may now be made in all counties of Nebraska except Douglas, Lancaster, and Sarpy. Since the program began in 1950, the VA has made nearly 3,500 direct loans to Nebraska veterans, totalling over \$30,000,000.
