CAPITOL CORNER

By Rep. Glenn Cunningham — Washington, D. C. (Special) — Many persons here were amazed to learn that the Justice Department has officially entered a case before the Supreme Court — on the side of Cuban dictator Castro!
The Justice Department has intervened against a U.S. sugar company and in behalf of the Castro-owned Banco Nacional de Cuba (National Bank of Cuba). The reason for the Justice Department action is almost unbelievable.
The Department says that if it were to stand up for the American company, it would "prove seriously offensive to, and injure relations with, the acting foreign state."
The case involves payment to the U.S. company for its sugar, factories and other properties seized unlawfully by Castro. I cannot imagine why the Justice Department is not standing up for the U.S. firm instead of Castro.

The recent spy activities of Russians assigned to the United Nations brings to mind the similar activities by all communist official missions in this country. The FBI has said repeatedly that most spy rings in this country are masterminded from these embassies.
Now there is a report from Switzerland as to the size of the Red Chinese delegations to that small country. Imagine what they would have here in the way of Embassy and personnel if they were recognized by the U.S. or seated in the United Nations.
In Switzerland there are 325 agents controlled by the Ambassador from Red China, 75 assigned to the Consulate, 80 more to the Commercial Consulate and 45 to the Economic Consulate. The military has another 120.
It is often said that it is almost impossible for the federal government to get rid of an inefficient worker — that such persons are transferred from job to job rather than dismissed.
The Civil Service Commission reports, however, that 14,000 federal employees were dismissed last year for deficiencies in conduct or performance on the job. Many others quit rather than face charges made against them.
