
GOVERNMENT BY INJUNCTION

On the fifth page of this paper will be found a full account of the killing of twenty-five striking coal miners near Hazelton, Pa., last week. In connection with this matter it is interesting to note what the St. Paul Dispatch. of Tuesday, a strong republican paper, has to say about "government by injunction," and other things:

The slaughter of the miners at Latimer, Pa., was a most deplorable event, but its direct consequences may be even more so. For the end of the trouble is not reached yet. When the strike had almost come to an end the criminal blunder of one man resulted in the causeless and useless massacre of twenty men and the wounding of forty more. To all appearances, they had done no wrong. They were moving together along the public highway, when they met the body of armed men who fired upon them with such fatal effect. The marchers may have intended to commit some outrage upon private property, but of that there was not the slightest evidence, nor had they in the least degree entered upon the performance of anything of the kind. It is a new thing in this country that men should be shot dead upon the mere guess of a sheriff that they

have in mind a contempt of court. But that massacre would never have occurred were it not for the injunction of a local judge ordering the sheriff to judge the motives of certain men and refuse them the use of the public highway. The judge who issued that order is primarily responsible for all the consequences, for he transgressed the constitutional provision giving the right of peaceable assemblage. That is a right which even the German reichstag would not take away from the socialists, though at the behest of

the emperor. The power of injunction can be made the instrument of the most complete and effective tyranny, by tying the hands of the executive and depriving the people of their rights. With the power of pronouncing acts of the legislature unconstitutional, and the injunction, unscrupulous judges can overturn the constitution and make themselves the sole government.




