


Dewey Lake. Range on Niobrara River, east of Fort Niobrara; all in Cherry County, Nebraska,


Simeon, Nebr. Cattle branded Range --- Gordon









JULIUS PETERSON Gregory, Neb Branded as on cut Range two miles oorth of Gregory
