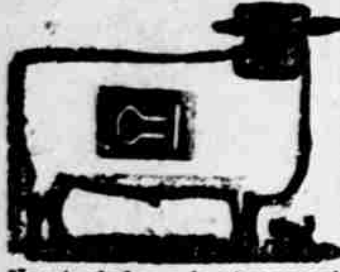

Disposal of Cases at the Last Term of District Court.

State of Nebraska vs Fred Boyce, adultery, dismissed upon motion of County Attorney.

State of Nebraska vs Grace Seager adultery, dismissed.

State of Nebraska vs John Green, murder, found guilty of manslaughter and sentenced to ten years at hard labor, Sunday excepted, and on the 26th of sept., the anniversary of his crime to solitary confinement.

State of Nebraska vs Fred VanNosttran, grand larceny, dismissed upon showing made by prosecution.

State of Nebraska vs Chas H Webster, selling mortgaged property, dismissed without prejudice.

State of Nebraska vs Soney Ford, murder, found guilty of manslaughter and sentenced to 7 years. Motion for new trial overruled. Def. ex. Second motion for new trial allowed to be withdrawn. Case was taken to the supreme court.

State of Nebraska vs Ida M. Irvin M Jones, obtaining money under false pretense, defendants appeared and each entered into a recognizance of \$500 for appearance on first day of next regular term of court.
