

Water-Heating Device.

The subjoined diagram, taken from brange Judd Farmer, illustrated how easily water can be warmed in a small way where both house and barn are furnished with running water and noderate plumbing arrangements. The pipe marked E F. running through the house cellar, furnishes water to the house and barn. By means of two short pipes, C D, the pipe from the hot water boiler in the house is connected with the pipe E F, which, as before stated, supplies the barn with cold water.

Then all that is necessary to fill the arn tub with warm water is to open he valve B and shut valve A, thus leting the warm water from the house oiler into the pipe which goes to the barn and shutting off the flow of cold.




