When the road is built it will be the shortest route between these points."

connect the Burlington and Great Northern in Nebraska. He said

by building a cut off bet by building a cut off between
O'Neill, Nebr., on the Willmar 0 Neill, Nebr., on the Willmar
and Sioux Falls division of the Great Northern, and Thedford,
Nebr., or a nearby point, on the Nebr., or a nearby point, on the
Burlington. This will give an almost direct route from St. Paul to Denver, and also between Duluth
and Denver. The route from Minneapolis to
Denver by the Great Northern Denver by the Great Northern
would be through Willmar, Manley and Sioux City to O Neill.
After the connection with Thedford on the Burlington and Missouri railroad is made, the rest is easy. A connection will be made
at Alliance with a north and south at Aliance with a north and south
line leading direct to Denver,
crossing the Gurnsey and Cheycrossing the Gurnsey and Cheyenne extension. At Alliance a
connection is made with the Black Hills line of the Burlington lead-
