Weather and Crop Report.

The U. S. weather bureau report for the week ending June 14, shows the extremes of temperature to have been respectively 89° on the 12th and 13th, and 48° on the 10th, a range of 41°, giving a mean for the period of 67°, the latter compared with the normal shows a loss of 2°. The precipitation again shows an abnormal amount, 1.53 inches, an increase of .69 of an inch. The gain above the normal since Jan. 1, is 2.49 inches. The winds have been about normal, 30 miles per hour from the northwest being the highest for the week.

The reports from the state at large show considerable damage from hail in limited areas. The injury from the Hessian fly is considerable in portions of Seward, York, Saline, Fillmore, Clay and Hamilton counties. Oats have grown well. Potatoes are promising. Corn has grown well and cultivation has progressed rapidly. Cherries are ripening and are generally a light crop. Apples dropping badly. Pastures good. Rain would be beneficial in most southern counties.


