Since the inauguration of the handseparative vetem the tendency of the cream in a it best suited his convenience. He has also neglected giving the same proper care. Consequently the general quality or standard of cream has been lowered. At the same time the patron expected the creamery company to pay the top price and seemingly did not realize that good cream was essential to make good butter and that poor butter meant lower prices for butter fat or a loss to the creamery man. From the fact that infrequency of delivery and thin cream are the principal causes for poor quality, we decided on January , 1906, to grade cream based on the Dist 19 following rules:

No. 1 cream would consist of cream that was delivered twice each week LD Cole in good condition and testing 30 per | G E Russell cent or over.

No. 2 cream would consist of cream that was delivered less frequently or testing less than 30 per cent.

A differential of three cents was paid between Nos. I and 2.
