At the back of the box, where the lid turns over, is stamped the quality of the cigar-Superfina, Fina, Flor, Superior and Bueno, being the terms in the descending scale. The color of the cigar is declared on the right-hand side or end of the box. Claro signifies the lightest colored, Colorado Claro rather darker, Colorado dark, Colorado Maduro darker, Maduro very dark, Oscuro extremely dark, Negro darkest .- London Chronicle.
