REGISTER AT VALENTINE

DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR, GEN-ERAL LAND OFFICE

Information Relative to the Opening of the Rosebud or Tripp County Lands.

Any person desiring to register for the opening of the Rosebud lands in South Dakota (Tripp County) under the President's recent proclamation, and the instructions issued by the Secretary of the Interior, must go before a U. S. commissioner or judge or a clerk of a court of record, or a notary public in one of the following towns, viz: Chamberlain, Dallas, Gregory, or Presho in South Dakota, or O'Neill or Valentine in Nebraska, and there sign and swear to an application for registration which will be furnished him by the officer before whom he makes his oath. This application must be sworn to between October 5 and October 17, 1908, and after it is sworn to it must be inclosed, unfolded, in an envelope, which will be furnished by the officer administering the oath, and the envelope must then be addressed and delivered to "James W. Witten, Superintendent of Opening," at either Dallas or Gregory, South Daof the applicant written on it.


