Spokane, Wash.—Prosper Marion, wanted at Valentine, Nebr., on a charge of having murdered Dock Murphy in 1884, is being held at Stevenson, Wash., awaiting instructions for officers in Cherry county, Nebr. When arrested Marion expressed surprise and denied his alleged identity.

Marion reached Stevenson three weeks ago, was seen in town a few days ago by Dr. Harris of Carson who knew Marion when he (Harris) was coroner in Cherry county, Nebr. Harris told his suspicion to Sheriff S. L. Knox of Skamania county, who sent word to Sheriff C. A. Rosseter at Valentine, Neb., and received a message from Rosseter to arrest Marion.

Harry Hazard of Stevenson also is certain Marion is the man he knew by that name in Nebraska. They met on the streets of Stevenson the other day and when he made himself known to the suspect Marion replied: "Yes, I know you," then turned on his heel and walked away.

Marion is accused of having killed Dock Murphy in a quarrel over possession of a load of wood.
