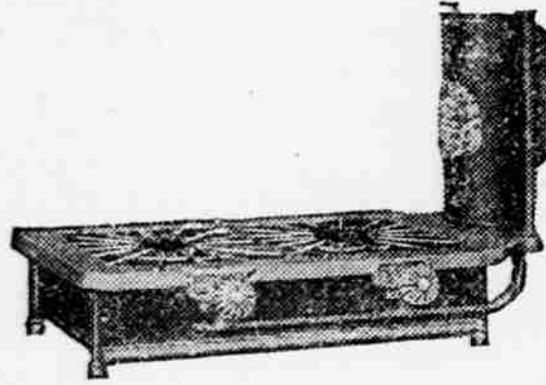

Obituary.

At Oakland, California, on August 26, 1909, Hiram Cornell peacefully passed to the Great Beyond.

Mr. Cornell was born in Ulster county, N. Y., June 24, 1815, and was at the time of his death 94 years, 2 months and 2 days old.

He was married to Sarah A. Haight, June 25, 1839, and lived until 1859 in New York state, in which year he moved with his family onto a farm in Calloway, county, Missouri.

On the breaking out of the Civil war he was commissioned a captain of the Enrolled Missouri Militia, and served as such until the close of the rebellion.

He removed from Missouri to Wisconsin in 1871, where he resided until 1884, when he came to Valentine, following his son, Charles, who had come to this country in 1880. He resided in Valentine until 1895, when he went with Mrs. Cornell to stay with a daughter in California, in hopes that a warmer climate would be more congenial to the latter's health. Mrs. Cornell died, however, at Lodi, that state, Jan. 28, 1896. They had, at that time, lived together over 56 years.

After the death of his wife he divided his time between his home in Valentine, on a property which he purchased in Mississippi, and California.

He leaves four daughters, Mrs. Shidy, Mrs. Leffingwell, Mrs. Moore and Mrs. Davis, and one son, Charles, of this place. The former three were with him during his final sickness.

Mr. and Mrs. Cornell were both brought up in the Quaker faith, and the former was a Mason since early manhood.

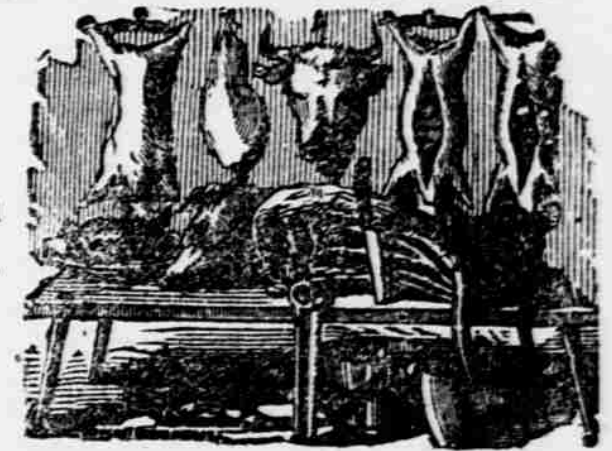
