JEFF AND JACK SIGN AGREEMENT TO FIGHT

New York, Oct. 29.—Jack Johnson and James J. Jeffries (the negro insisted that as present champion, his name should go first) signed articles in New York late this afternoon binding them to fight forty-five or more rounds to a finish, not later than July 5, 1910, before the club offering the best financial inducement, the winner to take a side bet of \$10,000 and 75 per cent of the purse, the loser to take 25 per cent.

Articles of Agreement.

The articles follow:
An agreement entered into this day between Jack Johnson and James J. Jeffries provides for the following.

First—They agree to box for the heavy-weight championship of the world.

Second—They agree to box before the club, organization or person offering the best financial inducements.

Third—Bids for the contest must be submitted on December 1, 1909, at 2 p. m., at the Hotel Albany, New York City.

Fourth—Each club, organization or person making a bid for the contest must have a representative on the ground who will post \$5,000 in coin or certified check to make good any and all stipulations of the bid.

Fifth—The referee is to be selected when the club bid is accepted.

Sixth—It is hereby agreed that the contest shall be of forty-five rounds or more.

Seventh—The purse shall be divided 75 per cent to the winner and 25 per cent to the loser.

Eighth—Each of the contestants herewith posts with Robert P. Murphy of New York, as temporary stakeholder, the sum of \$10,000. Of this sum each posts \$5,000 as a wager or side bet on the result of the contest and \$5,000 as a forfeit to guarantee compliance with these articles.

Ninth—The contest shall take place not later than July 5, 1910.

Tenth—It is hereby understood and agreed that the contest shall be fought under straight Marquis of Queensberry rules and with five-ounce gloves.

Eleventh—The final stake and forfeit holder is to be decided when the club is selected.
