
The arrest of the Lee family was a great surprise to the people of the vicinity. The family had lived in Sanders County four or five years and had borne an excellent reputation. Only about two weeks prior to his arrest Lee, sr., delivered a funeral sermon.

The senior Lee is seventy-one years old, but is mentally and physically alert and agile. He is the same Joseph Smith Lee, it is declaret, who was one of the band of "destroying angles" who swooped down upon and killed the emigrants in Utah at the Mountain Meadow massacre, many years ago, and who was left for dead in a hog pen.




