### Washington News.

(By a Special Correspondent.)

Blind to the last, the standpoint of the republican party—which is by far the biggest half of it—has decided to "stand pat" on these propositions:

That Aldrichism is a good thing for the country.

That Cannonism is a good thing for the country.

That the Payne-Aldrich tariff law is a God-send to the common people of the United States.

That any republican member of congress who votes against legislation recommended by the president thereby reads himself out of the party.

Right or wrong; win, lose or draw, the republican regulars have resolved on a desperate attempt to bluff the American people on these propositions. There is but one thing that will make a better impression on a campaign audience than a bluff, and that is a stupendous bluff. The Cannonites and the Aldrichites, master politicians that they are, will play this trump card. Political gamblers, they see a chance that the people may not have the courage to call their hand.

There is no time to turn back now. The regulars have crossed the Rubicon. The die has been cast.

Whether the American people are vigilant, or whether they are indifferent to conditions affecting the government of the country, is to be demonstrated once more. There are some who go so far as to say that the next two national elections involve such important issues as to make them in reality in the nature of a crisis in the history of this republic. Both democratic and republican partisans may consider this view as they will; either lightly or with respect, as may best please them.

None will deny, however, this fact: That the next two elections will be a crisis in the history of one of the two great parties of this country. It requires no flight of imagination to foresee that the progressive wing of the republican party, now in the minority, must become the majority. Otherwise the republican party would

monopolies to grow and go on untrammelled the day will come—it will not be in our day, but the day will come—when the American people will resort to a revolution as the people of France had to do, but it will be a peaceful revolution—an American revolution—not as violent and repulsive as the French, but as thorough and effective in its results."

United States Attorney General Wickersham was once more revealed as having dropped an important suit against corporations when Senator LaFollette had concluded his speech against the Taft-Wickersham railroad regulation bill. The speech was chiefly the story of monopolization of transportation facilities throughout New England by the New York, New Haven and Hartford railroad, the manipulation of state legislation to make this monopolization possible and the final crowning achievement of the monopolists in obtaining the dismissal of the government suit begun under Roosevelt to check the process of merging all the railroads, steam and electric. The dismissal of this suit by Wickersham came three months after he had taken office. It was ordered by him without investigation and without explanation, except such as does not explain at all. It is being recalled that Wickersham also dropped important suits against the beef trust soon after taking office; that he rendered a legal opinion upholding Ballinger and viciously attacking Louis R. Glavis; that he rendered another opinion legalizing the sale of 55,000 acres of rich Philippine sugar lands to the Havemeyer interests in the face of the organic law of the Philippines forbidding the sale of more than 2,500 acres of land to any single corporation; and that he framed the Taft railroad regulation bill which has been condemned by Republican Senators LaFollette, Clapp, Nelson, Cummins, Borah and Bristow.




