Proposed Constitutional Amendment

The following proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of Nebraska, as hereinafter set forth in full, is, submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska, to be voted upon trip Tuesday night, and will visit at the general election to be held Taesday, November 8th, A. D. 1910.

"A JOINT RESOLUTION to amend Section one (1) of Article seven (7) of the Constitution of the State of Ne raska.

Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the State

Section 1. (Amendment Constitution proposed.) That section one (1) of article seven (7 of the constitution of the state of Nebraska, the senate concurring, be so amended as to read as

Section 1. (Who are electors,) Every male citizen of the United States, of the age of twenty one years, who shall have been a resident of this state six months next preceding the election and of the county, precinct or ward, for the term provided by law shall be an elector; provided. Section 2. (Ballots) That at the general election nineteen hundred and ten (1910) there shall be submitted to the electors of the state for their approval or rejection the foregoing proposed amendment to the constitution relating to the There is something refreshing right of suffrage. At such election, on the ballot of each elector voting for or against said proposed amendment, shall be written or printed the words: "For proposed amendment to the constitution relating to the right of suffrage, and 'Against said proposed amendment to the constitution relating to the right of suffrage." Section 3, (Adoption.) If such amendment shall be approved by a majority of all e ectors voting at such election, said amendment shall constitute section one (1) of article seven (7) of




