

The fact that the independent prohibition party that has had a separate ticket in the field in Nebraska every year since the Slocumb law was passed, down to the present time, has withdrawn its ticket from the field this year and advised all prohibitionists to vote the Republican ticket, makes it difficult for the State Journal and the Republican leaders to explain to their constituents that that a prohibitory law is not a prohibitory law.

Proposed Constitutional Amendment

The following proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of Netraska, as hereinafter set forth in fu'l, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska, to be vited upon at the general election to be held Taesday, November 8th, A. D. 1910.

"A JOINT RESOLUTION to amend Section one (1) of Article seven (7) of the Constitution of the State of Ne raska.

Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska: Section 1. (Amendment Constitution pro-

posed.) That section one (1) of article seven (7) of horses, of the constitution of the state of Nebraska, the senate concurring, be so amended as to read as N on left jaw of horses Section 1. (Who are electors.) Every male

citizen of the United States, of the age of twenty one years, who shall have been a resident of this state six months next preceding the election and of the county, precinct or ward, for the term provided by law shall be an elector; provided, That person, of foreign birth who shall have declared their intention to become citizens comformably to the laws of the United States and are voting at the taking effect of this amendment, may continue to exercise the right of suffrage unth such time as they may have resided in the United States five years after which they shall take out full citizenship papers to be entilled to vote at any succeeding election,

Section 2. (Ballots) That at the general election nineteen hundred and ten (1910) there shall be submitted to the electors of the state for their approval or rejection the foregoing proposed amendment to the constitution relating to the right of suffrage. At such election, on the ballot of each elector voting for or against said proposed amendment, shall be written or printed the words: "For proposed amendment to the constitution relating to the right of suffrage,' and 'Against said proposed amendment to the constitution relating to the right of suffrage." Section 3. (Adoption.) If such amendment shall be approved by a majority of all e ectors oring at such election, said amendment shall constitute section one (1) of article seven (7) of the constitution of the state of Nebraska.




