**Commissioners Proceedings.**

Sept. 6, 1911.

The Board of County Commissioners of Cherry county, Nebraska, met pursuant to the call of the County Clerk for the purpose of selecting sixty names from which the petit jury for the special October 16, 1911 term of the District Court of Cherry county, Nebraska, shall be drawn and for the purpose of transacting any other county business which might be presented. There were present: N. S. Rowley, Chairman J. A. Adamson J. F. Naylor.

Sixty names were drawn from the assessment rolls from which the petit jury for the October term of the District Court shall be drawn.

Contract was entered into with J. W. Yeast for the furnishing of one car load of Olympic lump coal delivered at bin in court house at \$7.00 per ton in accordance with notice to bidders heretofore published by the County Clerk.

The Board adjourned to September 7th.

Sept. 7, 1911.

The Board met as per adjournment with all members present.

Upon consideration of the petition of K. F. Kime, et al, a new voting precinct was formed in Cherry county, to be known as Fern Precinct, comprising all the territory included within the following meets and bounds: Commencing at the North East (N. E.) corner of Township Twenty-nine (29), Range Thirty-two (32), thence running west to the North West (N. W.) corner of Section Three (3), Township Twenty-nine (29) Range Thirty-three (33), thence South to the South West (S. W.) corner of Section Thirty-four (34) Township Twenty-nine (29), Range Thirty-three (33), thence West to the North-west corner of Township Twenty-eight (28), Range Thirty-three (33), thence South to the South West (S. W.) corner of Township Twenty-eight (28) Range Thirty-three (33), thence East to the South East (S. E.) corner of Township (28), Range Thirty-two (32) thence North on the East line of Range Thirty-Two, to the North East corner of Township Twenty-nine, Range Thirty-two. 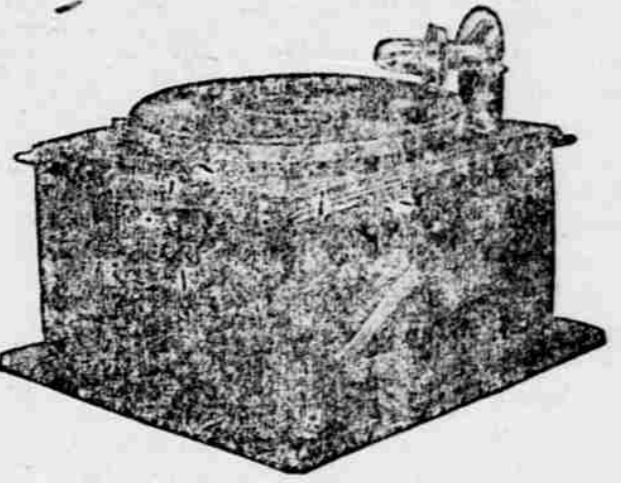
