"We have extended our tests so that seed from more than thirty counties in the state has been examined and we find that the situayou farmers test your seed corn and are absolutely sure it will germinate, you are going to be dissappointed when the crops are har-

"Well versed farmers, who have made a study of seed conditions tell me that they have never seen such a grave condition. The corn belies its looks. Some of it has the outward appearance of good corn but on the inside it is dead. The only way you can as certain the condition of your corn is by testing it. You must test or take the consequences.




