Report of February Meeting—Preparing to Go After the Delinquent Personal Taxes.

All expense incurred in the collection of delinquent taxes shall be paid by the person owing the tax, as the law provides that "No demand for taxes shall be necessary, but it shall be the duty of every person to attend at the treasurer's office and pay his taxes. And if any person neglects to so attend and pay his taxes the treasurer is directed to levy and collect the same together with the penalty and costs of collection." 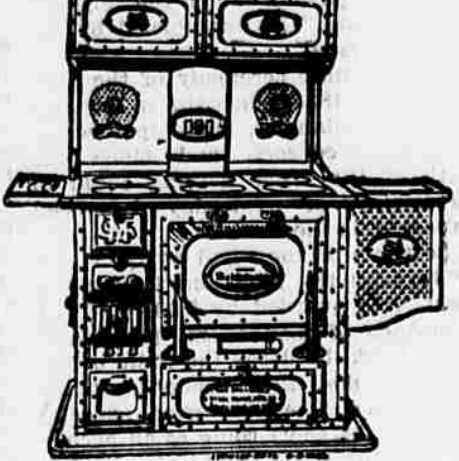
