appeared on the scene with various objections. They were enjoined and arrangements changed to suit their ideas but they finally set their feet down squarely and said that they would aid no such enterprise. They were men who should have been leaders in the movement but they were opposed and that settled it. The farmers and working people who cannot afford to go out in search of pleasure were denied it at home—are not even to be favored with ball games they can attend. Their sole duty and pleasure will be to attend to business. The promoters were certainly sincere in catering to the amusement of this class of people—they didn't contemplate injury, but benefit to the town. Perhaps they were not proceeding in the right direction but any of them would have been glad to have been placed right by those who knew all about it but refused to attend the meetings and express an opinion.

It is positively known that farmers and others have been complaining about the apparent selfishness of Norfolk. They have for several years been of the opinion that the business men have only cared for their money without offering an attraction to draw them here and make them feel that their companionship is desirable. True, there is baseball now, but few farmers care to come in and see the game and only those town people who have time to spare are permitted to enjoy the amusement, and it has the appearance of a more or less selfish enjoyment. It is very good as far as it goes but something of broader scope is undoubtedly required. The way the people come in to see a small circus is evidence that they are in a mood to be entertained and if Norfolk will not entertain others will. Some of them have money and will spend it where they find the best inducements. A number of surrounding towns have their fairs and Fourth of July celebrations every year and they are gainers by them, without question, but it has been several years since Norfolk has provided anything except a circus and these take out about as much money as they leave. In the opinion of many this lack of public enterprise is killing Norfolk. It needs an awakening and will not prosper to its fullest extent until all business men and citizens unite on some project or series of projects that will show it is not altogether selfish and non-enterprising.
