Give Inside History of the Merger Suit.

Attorney for Dummy Names Real Sponsors of the Legal Proceedings. Power Says He Got 100 Shares of Stock for Use of His Name.

New York, Aug. 22.-Lawyer George Alfred Lamb, attorney for Peter Power, went on the stand yesterday and told all he knew about the Northern Pacific merger sult. He named the men who, with Power as plaintiff and Captain Henry Stern as go-between, he said, had hoped to conceal their connection with the litigation and keep their identity hidden. Those he named were: W. Bourke Cockran, Camille Weidenfeld, H. Content & Co. and Edwin R. Thomas.

The story of Power's wanderings came out, and a plan to send him to Europe was revealed, as was his quasi connection with the suit at issue. Lamb said that he was practically forced by the people back of him to send Power away and that they paid the expenses of his trip to Montreal Weidenfeld, Cockran and other sponsors of the Power sult, Mr. Lamb declared, feared that Power would be broken down as a witness and would "give away the people behind it."

Peter Power himself was on the stand at the afternoon session. He said to the best of his belief he had received 100 shares of stock in payment for the use of his name. That was his sole interest in the suft.

W. Bourke Cockran characterized all the testimony relating to him as false in every detail.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.

The following proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Mebraska as hereinafter set forth in full, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 4, A. D. 1902.

A Joint Resolution proposing to amend section one of Article fifteen, of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, relative to the manner of submitting and adopting amendments to the Constitution of the State of Nebraska. Be it Resolved and Enacted by the Leg-

islature of the State of Nebraska: SECTION 1. That section one of Article fifteen of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska beamended to read as follows:

Section 1. Either branch of the legislature may propose amendments to this Constitution, and if the same be agreed




