New York, Oct. 8.—John Purroy Mitchell, who was acting mayor during Mayor Gaynor's sickness, admitted today in a letter addressed to Lieutenant Colonel Zolinski, deputy quartermaster, U. S. A., that so far neither he or his colleague, Police Commissioner Baker, has the goods on the army building, although the letter repeats that charge of gambling has been made against the army building neighborhood. The letter says Examining Inspector Amos picked three horses to win at Montreal and placed the bets in "the pool room" at the southeast corner of Whitehall and Pearl streets, which is the army building. Since Mayor Gaynor's letter of apology to Lieutenant Colonel Zolinski, Inspector Amos has admitted, his complaint should have read the "southwest corner."
