Telephone Lines and Numbers.

First.—To call give the crank one quick turn. This rings your bell and also signals the central office.

Jester Consented to Removal.

MEXICO, Mo., July 6.—Alexander Jester, accused of the murder of young Gilbert Gates 28 years ago, issued a statement in which he says his removal from Tecumseh, O. T., to this city, was with his own consent.

This statement will probably put an end to the charges of kidnaping now being made against the sheriff and district attorney in the territory, who turned Jester over to the Missouri sheriff.

SHARP BREAK IN WHEAT. Enormous Receipts in the Northwest Weakens the Grain Markets. CHICAGO, July 5.—Grain markets were extremely weak today, owing to a vast accumulation at primary points since last Saturday.

Wheat lost 1/2c, corn declined 5/8c and oats lost 1/2c. Provisions were influenced by the weakness in grain. Pork declined 10c, lard 5c and ribs 3c. Closing prices: Wheat—Sept., 75 1/2; Dec., 75 1/2. Corn—Sept., 33 1/2; Dec., 33 1/2. Oats—Sept., 20 1/2; Dec., 21 1/2. Pork—Sept., 48 1/2; Dec., 48 1/2. Ribs—Sept., 44 1/2. Lard—Sept., 65 1/2; Dec., 65 1/2. Cattle quotations: No. 2 red wheat, 74c; No. 3 spring, 70 1/2c; No. 2 hard, 71 1/2c; No. 2 corn, 34 1/2c; No. 2 oats, 24 1/2c.

Chicago Live Stock. CHICAGO, July 5.—Cattle—Receipts, 20,000; there was a good demand for cattle today and the offerings were well taken, nearly all classes of buyers taking hold confidently; buyers felt somewhat that there was a large supply for one day, while sellers reported prices went a shade lower in some instances; many lots sold 2c higher; cattle sold at \$3.00 to \$3.75 for heavy packing lots and fair to choice; poor to common brought \$2.75 to \$3.00; common to choice, \$3.00 to \$3.25. Hogs—Receipts, 30,000; hog were in fairly active demand and a shade lower; light hogs sold at \$8.00 to \$8.25; mixed, \$8.75 to \$9.00; heavy \$9.00 to \$9.25; pigs, \$3.50 to \$3.75, and culls, \$2.00 to \$3.00. Sheep—Receipts, 12,000; there was a fairly active demand for sheep for day and prices were fairly steady; sheep sold on a basis of \$2.00 to \$3.00 for culls up to \$5.00; 5.25 for prime ewes; yearlings were salable for \$5.25 to \$5.50, while spring lambs brought \$4.00 to \$4.50 for culls and \$5.00 to \$7.50 for best flocks.
