## FOUR DIE IN A WRECK.

Lives Lost in a Collision on the Frisco Road.

### FOUR OTHERS RECEIVE INJURIES.

Freight and Passenger Meet at a Sharp Curve—Conductor's Watch Was Thirteen Minutes Slow—Passengers Escape With a Severe Shaking Up.

KANSAS CITY, Sept. 21.—A passenger train northbound on the St. Louis and San Francisco railroad collided with a freight train 15 miles southeast of this city yesterday and four people were killed and four others more or less seriously injured. The dead: B. F. REDDICK, Springfield, Mo., engineer of freight. CHARLES RIDER, Springfield, Mo., fireman of passenger. HARRISON, Clinton, Mo., freight brakeman. UNKNOWN MAN, burned beyond identification.

The injured: Fred W. Laker, Springfield, Mo., engineer of passenger, leg crushed, throat cut and body badly scalded; will die. L. P. HALLOCK, postal clerk, Springfield, head bruised and cut. Fred A. Smith, Springfield, express messenger, head bruised and arms scalded. J. W. Haislett, Springfield, freight fireman, wound over eye, legs injured.

Fireman Ryder was buried beneath the baggage-mail car and burned to death, the car and its contents of mail and baggage being entirely consumed. The trains met at a sharp curve. The freight was running at a high rate of speed, bound on reaching Swope park to wait for the passenger. Freight Conductor Brownell's watch was 13 minutes slow, as it developed later. The engineer of the passenger train saw the other train only two or three seconds before the crash. Neither crew had time to jump. The passenger engine was telescoped by the postal and baggage car. Both engines were completely wrecked and several cars of cattle and hogs demolished and the live stock killed. The cars on the passenger train back of the combination car did not leave the track and the passengers suffered nothing more than a severe shaking up.

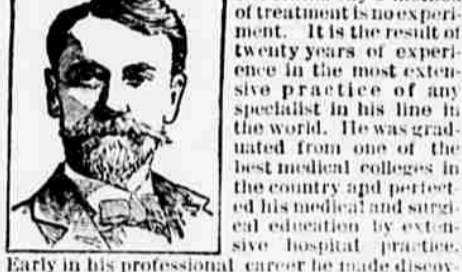
