FOREIGN JOTTINGS. MADRID special: Great excitement was caused by the discovery of an anarchist plot to blow up the Chamber of Deputies.

ROME special: The Tribune, referring to an offer of \$20,000 reported to be made by the United States in connection with the dispute over the New Orleans massacre, advises the Italian government to reject the offer.

PARIS special: The Journal Des Debats says that a serious quarrel is threatened between Spain and the United States owing to the latter country refusing to withdraw the appointment of a consul at San Juan de los Rios.

ST. PETERSBURG special: It is reported that a vessel trading on the Caspian Sea, between the Russian port of Baku and Persia, has been lost off the Persian coast.

LONDON special: Staffordshire potters and other manufacturers have decided to lock out 25,000 workers, the latter refusing to submit disputes with employers to a board of arbitration.
